

Title: Applying for an F31

Applying for an F31 is a great way to get funding if you are in the biomedical sciences. F31 fellowships are from the NIH and cover tuition, most of your stipend, and a small amount for supplies/travel.

What documents are required for an F31?

- Bibliography
- Research plan
- Selection of Sponsor
- Summary
- Specific Aims
- Background
- Cover letter
- Biosketch
- Introduction page
- Certification Letter (for diversity fellowships)
- Equipment
- Facilities
- Institutional environment
- Project narrative
- RCR
- Resource sharing
- Respective Contributions
- Sponsor statement(s)
- --Sponsor
- --Co-sponsor (if necessary)

What are the steps in applying for an F31?

**First, have a project or an idea for a project**

Most people apply for an F31 after qualifying for candidacy. If your qualifying exam is a written proposal, you might use that as the basis for your grant.

**Second, have some time to commit to writing and make a plan.**

Writing and editing can take a lot of time and focus, so it might be nice to clear your schedule for 4-6 weeks for an F31. Set deadlines for drafts of documents.

**Third, get in touch with your department's or university's grants manager.**

They have things to do behind the scenes and will help you set up an account and avoid any mishaps. They will be your best friend throughout this process!

**Fourth, read successful F31 proposals from friends and colleagues.**

Reading examples of solid proposals might give you ideas for your own proposal.

**Fifth, get started writing, outlining, and editing.**

After I outline, I like to just start writing in the middle. I will edit later.

**Sixth. seek out feedback!**

You can ask colleagues from other labs, members of your committee, professors whose lab you rotated in, and friends to read your drafts. I did this and got tons of feedback that helped my drafts improve each time!

**Seventh, plan to submit early to avoid errors.**

Formatting errors and lost documents will happen. I shared my documents in a Box folder with my grants manager to avoid version issues. I did this one day early.

Application deadlines: April 8<sup>th</sup>, August 8<sup>th</sup>, December 8<sup>th</sup>.
