WHAT ARE COMPONENTS OF A GOOD SYLLABUS?

☐ Welcome message emphasizing your enthusiasm and excitement
☐ Contact info for instructional team (email, student hours locations, etc)
☐ Course logistics (course title, meeting time, date, and location)
☐ Overall learning objectives and goals (skills, content, etc)
☐ Learning materials (textbooks including version, modeling software, etc),
where to get them, and whether or not they are required
☐ Grading scheme &scale (assessments, participation, self-reflections, etc)
\square consider a graphical representation and instructions for calculations
☐ Course schedule (including assignments, readings, assessments, etc)
☐ Statements and policies:
\square attendance \square disability accommodations \square communication
□ academic integrity (collaboration, plagiarism)
☐ flexibility (late work, extensions, re-grades)
□ participation/engagement (synchronous, asynchronous)
\square electronics in class (mobile devices, laptops)
\square support of student mental and physical health
☐ Links to resources on campus:
\square student health and counseling \square cultural centers and affinity centers
\square tutoring, advising offices, disability services \square basic needs
☐ Suggestions to promote success:
\square metacognitive and study strategies, links, and resources
\square suggestions and tips for success from former students
□ hidden curriculum (student hours, asking questions, mentorship, etc)
